



This system covers measures 125 to 128. The violin part begins with a sixteenth-note scale starting on G4, moving up to D5. The piano accompaniment features a steady sixteenth-note pattern in the right hand and a bass line in the left hand.

This system covers measures 145 to 151. The violin part plays a rhythmic pattern of eighth notes with a *f* dynamic. The piano part features a complex texture with chords and sixteenth-note patterns in both hands, also marked with *f*.

This system covers measures 152 to 158. The violin part plays a rhythmic pattern of eighth notes with a *mp* dynamic. The piano part continues with a similar texture, marked with *mp*.
